In addition to employment support we are also offering a variety of groups such as craft, music, artist support and gardening with the aim of improving social confidence in a safe environment.

Who can refer?

Takaka Residential and Rural Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Service, Probation, Golden Bay Community Workers and other approved services.

We can offer one to one support with:

- To listen to your ideas
- To work out what your goals are
- Looking at career paths
- Assisting you with writing a CV
- Helping you develop job seeking and interviewing skills
- Help with finding training opportunities, work placements and volunteer work
- Identifying training and employment options
- Providing access to a supported employment agency 'Helping Hands'
- Arranging support and mentoring in your workplace
- Helping you to get involved in the local community





'Helping Hands' is a supported work agency which provides paid part time employment to clients as a step towards gaining more permanent work in the wider community.

The purpose of the service is to enhance the quality of life and independence of people.

"Helping Hands" supervisors are available to provide mentoring and support.
